Appendix A

BELOW IS THE SECTION OF THE ACT 250 PERMIT PERTAINING TO WATERFRONT EVENTS

Event Specific Rules

- 20. The Parks and Recreation Commission shall maintain an Advisory Event Committee. The Committee shall include at least two residents from the Lake Street area, so long as at least two residents are willing to serve on the Committee. One purpose of the Committee will be to consider and recommend methods to mitigate the impact of Park events on residential neighbors (Revised Condition #12 of LUP #4C0863-1)
- 21. The Advisory Event Committee shall meet at least twice annually to review events and consider whether any recommendations should be made to the Parks and Recreation Commission. (Revised Condition #14 of LUP #4C0863-1).
- 22. The Department of Parks and Recreation shall adopt application guidelines and policies for events, subject to approval by the Parks and Recreation Commission at a warned meeting. The guidelines and policies may be amended through the appropriate municipal processes. Approved application guidelines and policies will be publicly available through the Department and on the Department's website. The public will have the opportunity to address the guidelines and policies through the appropriate municipal channels, which currently include: the Department of Parks and Recreation, at a Parks and Recreation Commission meeting, at a Neighborhood Planning Assembly, or before City Council. The City shall have a staff person, available by mobile phone, at each event or festival to respond to complaints from the public. The mobile phone number shall be published, at least, on the Waterfront Park web page (Revised Condition #18 of LUP #4C0863-1).
- 23. Condition #19 of LUP #4C0864-1 is modified as follows:
- a. There are no seasonal restrictions on events and festivals.
- **b**. This condition subpart is deleted.
- c. This condition subpart is deleted.
- d. Events may occur on no more than three consecutive weekends. (Condition #19d of LUP #4C0863-1 is retained in full) Page 3 of 4

- **e**. Average equivalent sound levels (Leq(event)) as measured on the sidewalk at a single point in front of the residences on Lake Street nearest to Waterfront Park shall not exceed the following limits over the course of a public event:
- 74 dBA for events 0 to 2 hours in length
- 71 dBA for events 2 to 4 hours in length
- 69 dBA for events 4 to 6 hours in length
- 68 dBA for events 6 to 8 hours in length
- 55 dBA Leg and 70 dBA LAFmax for set up and strike down activities from 11 PM to 7 AM
- 65 dBA Leg for set up and strike down activities from 7 AM to 11 PM

Independence Day and First Night fireworks events are exempt from the sound level thresholds. However, any other firework event must receive a permit amendment.

Event length is calculated from opening of gates to closing of gates except for musical concerts when it is calculated from start of amplified music to end of amplified music. Night time is defined as 11 PM to 7 AM for event or festival times (Revised Condition #19e of LUP #4C0863-1)

- f. The cutoff time for amplified sound or loud motorized sounds authorized by an event permit will be 11 PM. (Revised Condition #19f of LUP #4C0863-1)
- 24. Parks and Recreation Department staff shall monitor sound levels on the sidewalk in front of the residences on Lake Street nearest to Waterfront Park for at least 15 minutes on an hourly basis during portions of public events involving amplified sound or loud motorized sounds authorized by an event permit (e.g. show cars, ATVs, motorboats, etc.) including sound checks before the events start. Sound records will be kept for a three year period and will be made available to the public upon request. (Revised Condition #20 of LUP #4C0863-1).
- 25. Pedestrians exiting events to the South (toward College, Main and Battery Streets) shall be directed via signage, along the westerly side of the railroad tracks to exits on the southerly side of the park. Pedestrians exiting an event to the North (toward Depot Street) shall be directed via signage, along the westerly side of the railroad tracks to the northerly side of the Park and to exit along the northerly side of the Park.
- 26. To the extent reasonably possible, pickup and drop-off of event participants shall take place on the traffic circle at the intersection of Lake and College, not on Lake Street.
- 27. No generators or trucks associated with events at Waterfront Park may run overnight within the boundaries of Waterfront Park or within 500 feet of any residential property on Lake Street.
- Attendance over 700 people requires a police officer at the corner of Lake Street and College Street during event in a traffic control capacity.
